NEWS OF HFN EXECUTIVES & ACTIVITIES

HFN New EXCO

On 3rd February 2023, the Healthcare Federation of Nigeria (HFN) held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Elections. A new set of Executive Committee members were elected to lead the affairs of the federation for the next 2 years. Dr. Pamela Ajayi (President) and Mrs. Njide Ndili (Vice-President) were re-elected unopposed. Mrs. Chinyere Okorocha was elected as Treasurer, Dr. Segun Ebitanmi as Secretary and Pharm. Abimbola O. Adebakin as Public Relations Secretary.





FOASPS/USAID Grant

The Executive team is happy to announce that the FOASPS/USAID Grant contract was signed on the 24th of February 2023.

Fédération Ouest Africaine du Secteur Privé de la Santé (FOASPS)/ West Africa Private Healthcare Federation (WAPHF) identified nine (9) country federation members as part of the J2Su (Journey Toward Sustainability) project.

HFN ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES

The Healthcare Federation of Nigeria has undertaken several advocacy activities and submitted position papers to some government agencies in the first Half of 2023. Below are HFN advocacy activities for the first half of 2023:

On 15th February 2023, the Healthcare Federation of Nigeria went with key stakeholders of the private healthcare sector (GE, Emzor, JNCI, Nirropharm, etc.) and Dr Ngozi Azodoh, Director of Health Planning, Research and Statistics, Federal Ministry of Health for a meeting in Abuja with the Federal Ministry of Finance, Budget and National Planning. At the meeting, HFN presented a position paper on Fiscal Policy measures in Nigeria's Health Sector. The aim of the meeting was to request urgent action on critical fiscal policy measures to reposition Nigeria's healthcare sector in line with Nigeria's international convention obligations and in consonance with current global innovation/best practices to optimize domestic healthcare delivery and save lives. This engagement with the FMFBNP is still ongoing.

On 9th-10th and 16th-17th February 2023, the Healthcare Federation of Nigeria participated in a stakeholders forum on the development of Health Industries Corporation of Nigeria (HICON) Policy framework in Abuja and Lagos. Further to this, HFN submitted a position paper to the Hon. Minister of Industry, Trade and Investment on the development of Health Industries Corporation of Nigeria (HICON).





On 28th February 2023, the Healthcare Federation of Nigeria submitted a memorandum to the National Health Insurance Authority on the the National Health Insurance Authority (NHIA) operational guidelines. Following HFN submission, NHIA has made HFN a committee member for the development of NHIA operational guidelines.



Communique/Report

Healthcare Federation of Nigeria communique/report of the 2023 Annual Conference and General meeting held on 3rd and 4th February 2023 in Lagos. The communique was circulated to all the persons who attended the conference, all HFN community groups and relevant government agencies. We believe that the recommendations in the communique/report would support the growth and development of the sector and achieve Universal Health Coverage (UHC) for all Nigerians.

<u>REPORT</u>





The Healthcare Federation of Nigeria had a follow-up meeting with MDCN (Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria) on Diaspora Professionals. The discussion primarily on license centered issues and recommendations on possible resolutions to facilitate the reversal of brain drain and medical tourism. Dr Pamela informed the council that knowledge transfer/share through telemedicine was one of the models encouraged by HFN, and that HFN has been in discussions with the management of LUTH and LASUTH on promoting training with Teaching Hospitals.



HFN Diaspora Meeting

As part of the aim of HFN to work with Nigerian Health Professionals in Diaspora, meetings started in Atlanta Georgia, USA, and were also held in Birmingham, England and Sydney, Australia. Constructive discussions were held with diaspora Heathcare professionals who were keen to contribute to improving the quality of healthcare back home. They also asked HFN to play a role with assisting them to overcome obstacles and achieve this. During the events, a number of Nigerian Health Professionals in Diaspora registered as members of HFN.

Meetings with regional associations

The HFN team had meetings in Senegal and Cote d'Ivoire with the respective healthcare associations. In these meetings discussions were on the possibilities of partnership and collaboration between countries to improve the quality of healthcare within the region.





Courtesy call to AFCFTA

Following up on advocacy for health services to be made a priority sector in the Nigeria AfCFTA implementation strategy. On 1st June 2023, the HN team paid a follow-up visit to the recently appointed Secretary Nation Action Committee on African Continental Free Trade Area (AFCFTA) in person of Mr. Olusegun Awolowo. Mr Awolowo invited HFN to be a key stakeholder for healthcare in the GTI (Guided Trade Initiative) aimed at facilitating trade for exporters by creating a clear trade path and enhancing economic cooperation.

1st HFN Annual Conference

The HFN 2023 Annual Conference, themed "Building the Healthcare of Our Future", held on 3rd & 4th February 2023 at the Harbour Point, Victoria Island, Lagos and it addressed diverse issues affecting and limiting the growth of the health sector in Nigeria, from financing and investment to implementation of the New NHIA and its implications for HMOs, providers and employers, among others. The conference provided excellent opportunity for healthcare professionals, private healthcare providers, HMOs, health equipment manufacturers and healthcare sector investors to meet and network with other industry players. The conference was well attended by prominent stakeholders in the health sector which included The Honourable Minister of Health, Chairman, Senate Committee on Health, Hon. Commissioner of Health Lagos State, among other reputable dignitaries.


HFN Women Forum Webinar

HFN Annual Conference 2024




